Hi Sharon. One option might be to contact a cost estimator, rather than an architect. Another option, as you suggest, would be to talk to a builder/GC/CM. In either case, you'd need to have some idea of what it is they are estimating. For instance, just saying — we want to put a floor in where the skylight is would be impossible to attach a number to. But — installing a new boiler would be much easier. If there is a clear list of tasks that you are looking to attach some rough number to, that could be done by either an estimator or a GC/CM.
